Opening with Prayer

John 20:1-18

The Resurrection of Jesus

20 Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. ² So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." ³ Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. ⁴ The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, ⁷ and the cloth that had been on Jesus's head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸ Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed, ⁹ for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. ¹⁰ Then the disciples returned to their homes.

Jesus Appears to Mary Magdalene

¹¹ But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb, ¹² and she saw two angels in white sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. ¹³ They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴ When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Do not touch me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" ¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and she told them that he had said these things to her.

One: Join in the glad songs of all creation this day.

Many: Our voices praise the One who opens wide the gates of life.

One: We gather with those who see and believe, with those who stand and question, and with those somewhere in between, as we lift our Easter songs to you:

**Many: Holy, holy, holy are you, God who has made this day! All creation celebrates your constant love.

One: Blessed is the One who is revealed on this morning.

One: As we stand before the empty tomb, celebrating the great news of this day, we would have that faith which is a mystery:

Christ will come again, to hold us in steadfast love and hope.**

One: On this Easter morning, pour out your Spirit upon this ordinary bread that it might offer life, and on the cup that it might overflow with grace, and on your people gathered,

people with great faith, and those who struggle with it;
people who understand the mystery, and those who question;
people who have tried to follow Jesus, and those who have failed.
With the broken bread, you transform us into new people who will rejoice by
welcoming the stranger, listening to the ignored, and offering hope to those who grieve.
With the cup of grace, you nourish us so that we may delight in your people by
learning from those whose stories have never been told,
holding the hands of those whose only companion is loneliness,
walking with children who know the forgotten trails to joy.

Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts, that the bread we break and
the cup we bless may be true communion with you. By your Spirit make us one with Christ that we may be
one with all who share this feast. Give us courage to speak his truth, to seek his justice, and to love all, as
Christ loves each of us gathered. Let us now offer up prayers for those who are grieving, sick, struggling, or
despondent

One: And in the same manner, he also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant, sealed in
my blood, given for the forgiveness of sin. Drink from it, all of you. Do this remembering me."

(If you are worshipping with us livestream, please take what you are using for the cup of salvation and hold it up)

One: The cup of Salvation, poured out for you, take and drink
